### Improvement Strategies for Management of the Central Urban Planning Committee

This research aims to reestablish the role of the Central Urban Planning Committee and suggest the strategies to support its operation.

On Chapter 2 and 3, issues in terms of functional and operational aspects are analyzed based on the current committee operation condition. In addition, some operation cases of the local urban planning committees are reviewed in Seoul metropolitan city and Gyeonggi province and similar committees of United Kingdom and Japan.

Considering this review, on Chapter 4, strategies to reinforce deliberative and advisory duties of the committee and improve operation support are as follows:

First, to enhance the deliberative and advisory duties of the committee, 1) utilizing the standard organized by agenda types, 2) defining the agenda types that Central Urban Planning Committee needs to consult and the committee can also conduct the investigation and research if it is needed. 3) adjusting the subcommittees duties to reduce the meeting time and provide in-depth

professional deliberation and promoting pre-committees to review agendas in advance.

Second, to reinforce operation support of the committee, 1) organizing and running the ‘civilian panel select committee’ to consider the fairness of constitution process and objectively evaluate the professionalism of the civilian committee members, 2) establishing deliberation result archive and publishing the annual report to induce consistent deliberation, 3) expending human resources in management department and considering the committee's status in Ministry of Land, Infrastructure and Transport to ensure the committee's independence.

On final Chapter 5, deliberation guidelines on major agenda types are suggested so that it can contribute to professional and effective deliberation of the Central Urban Planning Committee.
